Key Events by Month

January

Academic Performance


As you may know our performance as a school is measured in the main by how well our children do in tests and assessments. This is done in two ways – how many achieve the level nationally expected of them for their age and how many make nationally expected progress from where they start. You may also know that the children are assessed and the data sent to the Department for Education, Ofsted and the Local Authority at the end of reception, Year 1 (for phonics) and Years 2 and 6 for reading, writing and maths. This year due to the Pandemic there were no statutory assessments but most of these will be taking place in 2021. Teachers have worked tirelessly this term to address any gaps in learning that happened as a result of the lockdown and we thank you for your support in this.

We have identified a need to refocus on our reading and we are looking at ways of ensuring that all the amazing things we have done previously for reading are in place. This will include looking into a Covid-safe way of collecting reads on the Red Ted and Read to Succeed scheme.

You still have access to Education City, Times Tables Rockstars and Lexia at home. Please do make use of these as anything you do will support your child/ren.

2020 will definitely be a year we won't forget. We know that many of you have been personally affected by Covid-19 but we thank you all for supporting us through this difficult period.
