#### Attendance

Attending school every day is vital in ensuring children get the best education. Our current attendance rate for the school is Well done to xxx who are above our target of 97%.

Being on time is also very important. Being late can mean children miss vital learning and the chance to start the day with their peers. School starts at 8.55am and children need to be in class or their line at that time. Please allow sufficient time to walk to the classroom when arriving.



Time off in term time will only be granted in exceptional circumstances. You must request this in advance. Unauthorised absences may incur a penalty fine of £60 per parent.

At the end of the Autumn term we will be holding a raffle prize draw for attendance. For every complete week that your child is in school, in Autumn 2, they will get a raffle ticket that goes into a draw at the end of term to win a prize.

On 26th September, 12 children from Year 6 represented the school at the U12 Cross-country competition at Newmarket Academy.
