Attendance

Attending school every day is vital in ensuring children get the best education. Our current attendance rate for the school is **95.9%.** We have an amazing 9 classes who are at or above our target of 97%. Well done to Nursery, Apricot, Strawberry, Loganberry, Lightning, Eagle, Osprey, Spitfire and Typhoon.

Being on time is also very important. Being late can mean children miss vital learning and the chance to start the day with their peers. School starts at 8.45am and children need to be in class at that time. Please allow sufficient time to walk to the classroom when arriving. Please drop children in the main school before Nursery. A huge thank you to those who are making it in on time.

We have a new attendance policy which is accessible on our website. Any requests for time off in term time must be made in advance and will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances—please check the policy carefully and don't assume things will be authorised.
