## A message from the **PRINCIPAL**



#### Dear Parents/Carers,

This half term we have launched the changes to our behaviour system with the introduction of GREAT points. These are similar to Dojo points but the children are able to earn more points for certain things. We have been focusing on ensuring we have the correct uniform to make us 'ready' for our learning. Anti-Bullying Week

Last month contained Anti-Bullying Week and we have been learning about what bullying is and why it is important that we all speak out about it. The theme this year was 'Make a Noise' and we have learnt that anyone can make a stand against bullying. Children have learnt they can tell a trusted adult if they experience or witness bullying.

We have revisited the acronym STOP (Several Times On Purpose) to describe bullying and have also learnt that this can also stand for Start Telling Other People.

Attending school every day is vital in ensuring children get the best education. Our current attendance rate for the school is **95.1%**. Last half term we had 7 classes at 97% or higher. Well done to Eagle, Osprey and Lightning who had 98% attendance and Typhoon, Spitfire, Loganberry and Mango who had 97% attendance.

Being on time is also very important. Being late can mean children miss vital learning and the chance to start the day with their peers. School starts at 8.45am and children need to be in class at that time. Please allow sufficient time to walk to the classroom when arriving. Please drop children in the main school before Nursery. A huge thank you to those who are making it in on time.

## **Staffing**

## Behaviour

This term we started using a new behaviour and reward system. The children have been busy collecting our new **GREAT** points for a

range of good behaviour, for example:

Following the academy's rules of being safe, ready and respectful Great homework Working well in a team Wearing correct uniform

Being kind

Being helpful

Being in school all week

Speaking well in class

Following the Great Heath Way

The children can be awarded 1 or 5 points by staff for showing these behaviours. When they reach 50 points they can select from the prize pot, which several children have already achieved this term. The prizes become bigger at 100 and then 150 and so on.

The teachers will shortly be selecting children in their class for our Bronze Behaviour award that rewards excellent behaviour for the whole term. This is worth 10 points to the children and a certificate in our end of term assembly.

Thank you to all parents that have managed to access the My Child at School app. We will be gradually using this more to communicate with you and send letters and information, allowing us to phase out the use of Parentmail. If you are still having problems please contact Mr Hicks.





On Wednesday 4th October 10 children from Year 6 competed in a football tournament at Great Heath. They played well, winning their group and progressing to the semi-final. They unfortunately narrowly lost this game on penalties but won the 3rd/4th play off to finish in Bronze position.

The next tournament was on Tuesday 10th October and Great Heath entered 2 teams of Year 4 children. They played well with a great deal of spirit, finishing 13th and 16th. The spirit and determination did not go unnoticed as they won the fair play award.

On Monday 16th October 10 Year 6 girls played in the next tournament at Great Heath. Again they played well and finished joint 2nd in their pool. Unfortunately the winners of the group only progressed to the semifinals.

The last football tournament of the year was on Wednesday 18th October and 20 boys from Years 5 and 6 competed. Great Heath 2 finished 18th, having played well in their pool. However, Great Heath 1 finished 1st in their pool to progress to the semi-final, which they won and narrowly lost 1 0 in the final to Moulton, finishing in Silver position.
