Welcome to Year 4!



English

Our focus book this first half-term is: The Borrowers by Mary Norton.

Maths

White Røse Maths

As a school, we are using 'White Rose Maths'. The scheme has a firm belief that number underpins almost every area of mathematics, so, for the first four weeks back we'll be focusing on place value to ensure the children have a firm understanding of number. Over the rest of the half-term we'll be covering decimals, money and time.

If you would like to know more about the scheme, or how you can best support your child with maths at home, please do speak with us or take a look at the 'White Rose' website. There's a great section for parents and carers with advice as well as free mini workbooks that can be downloaded if you so wish to help consolidate in school learning (please don't feel you have to do this).

In June, all Year 4 children are expected to undertake a multiplication check as per government guidelines. As such we will focus heavily on recall of all times tables up to 12 x 12. The test requires rapid recall with only 6 seconds per question, Any support you could give with this will be so beneficial to the children. A few minutes each evening just practising can really build your child's confidence. We strongly encourage the use of Times Tables Rockstars.

Topic



Our topic this half-term is 'Ancient Civilisations'. This is a History topic.

In this topic the children will explore the history of three of the world's first ancient civilisations: ancient Sumer, ancient Egypt and the Indus Valley civilisation. They will learn about the rise, life, achievements and eventual end of each civilisation.

French: We will be looking at the correct vocabulary to describe the different festivals and holidays.

Religious Education: Learning about Christianity and how Christians engage with the idea of being on a mission.

PHSE – Jigsaw: Our theme is 'Relationships' and the children will be focusing on fostering healthy relationships and equipping children with the skills to navigate various social situations.

PE

Just a reminder that on your child's PE day, they will be changing at school. Please ensure they bring their kit in at the start of the week and it is suitable for the weather conditions. Children should wear black trainers, black shorts or tracksuit bottoms with the green school logo PE top and their school jumper. Please make sure it is all named - especially jumpers as these may be taken off during the day. Hats and gloves may also be worn if cold.

Homework

Homework is a great opportunity for you as parents/carers to support your child's education as well as a way to celebrate successes both in and out of school. In Year 4, weekly homework will be set on a FRIDAY and due by the following WEDNESDAY. This weekly homework will consist of spellings to revise as well as times tables to be learnt. There is also a '10 Minute Workout' book which is sent home weekly. Please could your child complete one 'workout' each week and return this to class by Wednesday.

We will also, from time to time, set homework tasks on Purple Mash. These can be found under the '2Do' tab.

We strongly encourage the use of Times Tables Rockstars and Lexia at home, as both these programmes greatly support your child's education.

Reading

Each child will have a book to read daily in school from our 'Accelerated Reader' scheme which can be taken home each evening along with their reading log book. We encourage you to read daily at home with your child to help develop their reading skills. This could be their AR book or any other book, magazine, comic or text. Their AR book uses reading range levels that are designed to give suitable challenge to each child and we would rather all children choose a book they are eager to read rather than having to find something they are not enthused about!

At Great Heath, all home reading is celebrated and the children can earn themselves rewards. It would be great if you could sign your child's log book every time they do read aloud to an adult or sibling for us to ensure this is counted towards the 'Read to Succeed' scheme.

Music

This term we are using a new Music scheme called Charanga. This scheme will help develop your child's musical understanding, focusing particularly on pulse, beat and rhythm. Each half term has a focus song that is used a the basis of the learning. This half term's song is Lean on Me by Bill Withers. Within this, we will incorporate the use of Recorders. Your child also has access to Charanga at home, if they wish to use it.
