
Routine

At the start of the day, children will come into the classroom at **8.40 a.m.** Your child needs to be ready with everything they require for the day's learning including reading books and reading records.

English


Reading: The children will continue to read their Accelerated Reader books in school and take quizzes. Each child will also choose a library book and we expect all children to read regularly at home. **Please ensure their reading record book is signed by an adult.**

Literacy led English curriculum: At Great Heath Academy, our English curriculum is led by high quality literacy texts. This term we will be studying the following books:



[The Secret Garden by Frances Hodgson Burnett](#)

Whilst reading this text we will be writing in the first person through a series of recounts. We will also be focussing on the use of formal and informal language and the differences between explanation and information texts.



[The Unforgotten Coat by Frank Cottrell-Boyce](#)

Through this text we will aim to develop narrative writing techniques to include integrating dialogue to convey character and advance the action. We will focus on the genres of folktales and realistic fiction.

We will study and learn to recite selected poems from this classic text.

Maths

We will continue to use White Rose Maths. The topics studied this term are: ratio, algebra, fractions, decimals and percentages, plus area, perimeter and volume and statistics.

Topics

This term's topic is 'Frozen Kingdoms', which has a geography focus. Children will revisit their learning of geographical features of the Earth and learn about Arctic and Antarctic regions building on their understanding of climate zones. They will also research and describe the significant achievements of polar explorers.

We will also be looking at Art, Design and Technology and Science through various companion projects.

P.E.

The PE units for this term are netball, hockey, dodgeball and yoga. Children must bring their P.E. kit into school on a Monday and these will stay in school until Friday. Many P.E. lessons will be outside therefore the children can wear black shorts or jogging bottoms and trainers, their green school P.E. T-shirt and school jumper. **Please ensure all P.E. kits are named.** All jewellery must be removed for PE lessons.

Homework expectations

As well as encouraging daily reading at home, weekly activities will be set from each of their CGP Reading, Grammar and Punctuation, Spelling, and Maths books.

In addition, it would benefit children to continue to regularly practise spelling words from the Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 statutory spelling lists. Tasks are also set on Freckle and children can access this and TT Rockstars at home.
